Meter of the Month

On pages 6-1, 121-4 and 126-3, 'Refill Receipts' produced by Pitney Bowes franking machines were illustrated. Now, Robert Petts reports an example of a Francotyp-Postalia 'Postage Download Receipt' - produced on a 'PostBase' machine. A 'Zero Test' frank from the same machine, FP6114505, is shown below – note the inclusion of 'UK' above the date.





A photo of the actual machine is shown on the left.

Peter Huss reports that a new model, the 'PostBase Mini' (shown right) was authorised for use in the UK in the Spring of 2015. At this stage, it is unknown whether a new serial prefix will be used for the PostBase Mini.

With reference to page 175-7, John Fowler reports that when the new rates came into force at the end of March 2015, the Europe and ROW 60g limits were changed to 100g. Whether the codes previously used for the 60g rates (codes 6002 and 6097) have been retained for the new 100g rates or whether new codes have been assigned is not known at this stage.

Recent Interesting Items

It is unusual to find examples of meter franks from the Outer Hebrides. Duncan James reports this one from the Isle of Lewis.



Further to page 120-6, Peter Mantell reports another "London / London" example.



Patrick Awcock sends this item that has been franked twice – firstly with a 'Zero Test' frank and then with a normal '1 Letter' frank. The matrix code is, of course, impossible to decode.



Peter Mantell reports this frank from a Neopost IS240/280 machine, that has two (slightly different sized) squares appearing in the Return Address Block.



Coloured Slogans

Peter Mantell reports this monster frank with the slogan in colour from a Payment Protection Insurance claims company called Real Time Claims.

Peter has also found these three return address franks in black.



On page 168-9 a frank from Westland Horticulture was shown with the return address in black. Your editor has now found an example but with a pale green colour.



Meter Correction Handstamps

Gwynne Harries sends this item from 1969 from Sotheby auctioneers that was franked with 3 pounds 5d of payment! The item duly received a handstamp that asked for the cover to be returned in order for the account to be adjusted. Presumably it never was.



Historic Items / Thematics

On page 107-4 we illustrated a specimen frank from machine RN 000 dated 2 Oct 54 that depicted a slogan regarding free advertising space in the frank. Now, Peter Mantell has found this nice slogan from the same machine dated one week earlier stating that Neopost franking is "safer, quicker and cheaper". Editor: Assuming that the comparison was being done with using stamps, I'm not quite sure how they could claim that franking is safer!



Peter Mantell sends this Automax frank from 1967 that has the serial appearing to be underlined. This effect is presumably due to the die being incorrectly seated in the machine.


Peter Mantell has acquired this Midget model frank on a 'specimen card'. It was almost certainly produced by a demonstration machine at the 1938 Business Efficiency Exhibition. It is interesting to note that it has a GvR (design B) frank because the GviR (design D) indicia was fitted on all new machines in 1937. You would have thought that a new machine would have been on show at such a prestigious exhibition.



Peter has also acquired this Universal model frank on a 'specimen card'. This was likely to have been produced by a demonstration machine at the 1956 Business Efficiency Exhibition.



Your editor has acquired this attractive USA cover from 1960 that commemorated the 60th Anniversary of the U.S.S. Holland submarine. The frank itself depicts the firing of a Polaris missile on a modern-day submarine, together with a scale drawing of the Holland.

Peter Mantell has found this attractive frank from 1967, showing a seahorse.




Peter Mantell also sends this nice 1967 shipping thematic from the port of Bristol.

Alan Godfrey sends this frank from the Marshall Motor Group, Peterborough - depicting their logo together with those of 8 manufacturing brands that the group supports.


