

#### **Meter of the Month**

Peter Huss kindly sends details of a new Neopost model, namely the IN-700 Series. The illustration shows a specimen frank from the 2013 Post-Expo exhibition in Austria.



Approval for the use of this new model is expected during November 2013 in the US and in Germany. Approval for use in the UK is expected within the next two years. The IN-700 is capable of processing items at a speed of 140 lpm or 75 lpm if the Dynamic Scale is used. The following, taken from the brochure, identifies the main sections of the machine.










The item has, presumably, been franked by the Traffic Enforcement Centre on behalf of Plymouth City Council. 


#### **Recent Interesting Items continued**



## **Pitney Bowes Connect+ Coloured Franks**





The item has been franked by a company called 'Post Modern' – one of a number of companies that operate private postal services in Germany. The model of the machine that produced the frank is not known.
