





Meter of the Month

Peter Huss from Germany kindly sends our first report of an Overseas Airmail 'Design J' frank. This is indicated by "ROW2" in the indicia – "ROW" standing for "Rest Of World". The item was incorrectly franked by the user as it should have assigned "Europe" – see example on page 164-6. Decoding the matrix block (see page 162-8) shows that the Mail Type assigned to this item was 6097. This extends the summary table shown on page 6 of this newsletter. The full image is shown below.



Peter also sends this item from the same user a year showing a town die of Southampton, thus allowing us to identify the town of origin. The town die information is sorely missed by us collectors and is the main criticism of the new matrix format.



Your editor would appreciate further examples of 'overseas' franks as, obviously, these are rarely seen in the UK.

Recent Interesting Items

Your editor reports a Francotyp-Postalia FM211 'dead series' frank that has been converted to the new 'Design J' format.




The opinion regarding the 'Design J' format is mostly unfavourable, mainly because the town of origin is no longer shown. However, your editor has found a case where there is an advantage. In the example below, the serial number is totally illegible because of a printing malfunction, but decoding the matrix block enables it to be determined, i.e. PB162244.



On page 164-6 an example of the 'Design J' format to Europe was shown. This item, although not mentioned at the time, also had "UK" inscribed above the date. Presumably, this is automatically inserted on items going abroad to meet international regulations. However, your editor has found "UK" appearing on an inland letter. Note also that the example of this same machine shown on page 165-4 did not have "UK" inscribed.

Historic Meter Franks

Peter Mantell has recently acquired three Pitney Bowes specimen franks from 1968. The first two, in Design F (Emblems), bear the serial "SPEC.8".



The following item, dated 30th May 1968 is the earliest Design H recorded and it precedes the formal launch of this design on 12th June 1968.




Peter also sends this Pitney Bowes specimen frank from 1972 with the meter serial number blocked out.
