Meter of the Month

Further to page 169-1, your editor reports a second example of a QR Code that has been incorporated into a UK meter frank. It comes from a company called TM Electronics Ltd., based in Worthing, West Sussex. When scanned, the QR code reveals their web site at: <u>http://www.tmelectronics.co.uk/</u>. Pitney Bowes – New Model

Peter Huss reports the appearance of a new franking machine on the Pitney Bowes web site, namely the DM60 (K700 series). This model is a low volume machine with a stated throughput of 18 letters per minute.

At this stage, the corresponding serial prefix for this model cannot be confirmed. However, the 7-digit PB2 series appeared on live mail a few months ago, and this is a possibility. The operating instructions for this model show a MailmarkTM frank which would support this assumption.



Furthermore, the Pitney Bowes 'Franking Machine Warehouse' web site now states that the DM 50, 55 and 60 are available in Mailmark format as an option. For example, see http://pitneybowesdm50.franking-machine-warehouse.co.uk/dm50-mailmark-franking-machine/







Recent Interesting Items

Peter Huss reports an underpayment of a mail item sent to Germany that escaped detection. The user has franked this as 'Advanced Mail' but, according to the Royal Mail Cleanmail Advance User Guide, that service is only available for UK destination addresses. Note also that for overseas mail, 'UK' should show above the date, but is missing in this case.



Further to page 174-5 and earlier, Peter Mantell reports a further example of a Mailmark Surcharge Payment. As with previous examples, the Mail Type code is '9999'.



On page 162-6 we reported an example of a DM100i machine (PB858175) using coloured ink in the frank. This turns out to be an erroneous report as a recent example reveals that the coloured return address was, in fact, applied by a handstamp! Your editor was taken in by the perfect alignment of the original – my humble apologies for this mistake.



Peter Mantell sends a further four examples of coloured franks this month.




Mailmark[™] News

In past issues of the newsletter (e.g. page 172-6), we have shown examples of Mailmark franks being applied in red ink. Until now it was not known whether this was against any Royal Mail regulation. Your editor has recently found the following web site which states that only blue ink should be used. Furthermore, this site also requests that only white envelopes should be used!

This allows us to extend the Mail Type table as follows:



Peter has also found this 'Stamp Exhibition' slogan from 1937 (Design C) on Ebay.



In September 2014 a fourth school, Beulah Infants, joined the Trust.

Further to page 166-6, Jan Lannoye reports another example of this built-in Air Mail logo, depicting a Lockheed Constellation. This example is from a MailMax (FSC9 series) machine, whereas the previous example was from a Mailspirit (FSC7 series) machine.
