
Meter of the Month

Francotyp-Postalia – New Series

Peter Mantell and your editor report sightings of a new FP711 series which has possibly been produced by the new Qi 3000 machine, featured last month on page 177-6. The lowest number FP7110024, from Peter Mantell, is shown below.



The earliest example, FP7110843 dated 04-08-15, found by your editor, is shown on page 3 as a highest number. The high number itself puts some doubt on whether this is actually an example of the top-of-the-range Qi 3000 as this number of machines would surely not have been made or sold at this stage.

Further to page 168-5, your editor reports a second Francotyp-Postalia Centormail example in Design J format. Although it is not the highest number seen for a Centormail machine, it is the highest seen in that format.



Recent Interesting Items

Further to page 177-1, Peter Mantell has now found an example of an Advanced Mail item but without any Advanced Mail block. Is this the sign of things to come? This is a sad day, if that is the case.



Recent Interesting Items continued

Further to page 175-1, your editor has found a third example (PB2005049) of a QR code in a meter frank. This decodes as http://stores.ebay.co.uk/sanstampsstampsjewellerycoins?, even though it has been over-cancelled with a Royal Mail postmark.



Your editor reports this lowest recorded number for the NE6 series (NE6000015).



Peter Mantell reports this frank from a PostBase machine where the return address is shown twice. This effect appears to be a happening quite a few times on new Francotyp-Postalia machines. The reason for this occurrence is unknown but possibly the user set-up instructions are unclear.



Your editor has found a similar occurrence but this time on a Frama machine. Here, the return address is partially printed and at a slight angle. This is more likely to be the result of a machine malfunction rather than a user error. Note also that the item also contains 'UK' in the matrix block.



Mailmark[™] News

Further to the report on page 1, the 'International Tracked & Signed' item has the Mail Type code '6522'.

Further to the report last month on page 177-5 regarding the confusion over whether a new Mail Type code for the 100g rate to Europe has been assigned, Peter Huss reports another 'A Europe 100g' example (see below). The matrix block in this frank contains a new Mail Type code, namely '6201'. This implies that the machine bearing the '6002' code reported last month had probably not been updated with the latest software.



Peter Huss also sends a recent example of the 250g rate to Europe. In alignment with the change to the 100g rate, the Mail Type code for this rate appears to have changed from '6032' to '6202' when the rate changes were brought in earlier this year.



Peter Mantell reports a new 2kg weight associated with the '1PM' (Special Delivery) service. The Mail Type code for this is, surprisingly, '0104' - seen previously on the '2 Large 750g' rate! Perhaps there has been some further re-allocation of Mail Type codes? Time will tell, no doubt.









Duncan James also reports this coloured slogan from Stagecoach in Glasgow.




Last of Breed


Historic Items

Robert Petts report this Neopost 5450/60 specimen frank from 1996 with the serial 5NE00001. Your editor recalls visiting a Mailroom Exhibition around that time where such specimen franks were readily available on the Neopost stand and this may well have been the source.



Historic Items

Further to page 177-9, Mike Jackson reports an earlier example of a Design B frank, dated 10 March 1927. It comes from Arthur Wheeler & Co., Leicester. It is unusual to see a Neopost machine being used by that company – normally they franked their mail with Pitney Bowes machines.



Mike points out that, according to Jack Peach's articles in GSM, Design B was announced and illustrated in the Post Office Circular dated 9 March 1927 and 'would shortly be brought into use'. The Circular was the means by which postmasters received their instructions, so presumably the 9 March 1927 issue of the Circular should have been in postmasters' hands before covers bearing the new Design B frank arrived at their office - otherwise they wouldn't know if the new franks were valid. So, assuming we take the information and dates at face value, it could well be that 10 March 1927 is the earliest possible date for Design B.


