Meter of the Month

My meter of the month comes from Peter Mantell and it shows a 7-digit serial number, rather than the usual 6 digits for Connect+ machines. This is similar to the situation back in October 2014 when 7-digit serial numbers for the PB662 series first appeared (page 168-1). The full image of this frank, PB5575257, is shown below.



Decoding the matrix block confirms this serial number and the item number decodes as '0000437'. This would tend to suggest it is a new machine or a recently 'converted' machine, e.g. for a battery replacement.

In order to understand what is happening, the following questions come to mind

- (1) Is it a one-off error or, more likely, is it one of many to come with 7 digits?
- (2) Have Royal Mail requested that all Mailmark franks are assigned a 7 digit number?
- (3) In time, will all existing Pitney Bowes Connect+ machines with 6 digits get converted to ones with 7 digits?
- (4) In due course, can we expect to see the same thing happening with the PB1 series (currently the only other series with 6 digits)?
- (5) If it is a new series, why does it start with a seemingly random number? However, it is worth remembering that the PB662 series also started at a fairly random number (see page 168-1).

With just one report, we are unable to answer these questions, but with more examples, things may become a bit clearer. It is easy to overlook such items and it goes without saying that further reports of 7-figure Connect+ franks would be most welcome.



'Last of Breed' franks

Peter Mantell has found two examples of franks applied by 'old technology' Hasler machines, but both are interesting. Like all other Hasler machines still in use today, these two are from users situated in Northern Ireland, and both are looking somewhat sorry for themselves! The first one is a 'Smile' machine with the serial HS26267R but the town is missing, leaving the central die just reading 'Co. Tyrone'.



The second example, with the serial HT38001Z, is a '300 Series' with the rare 'Z' serial suffix. Further information on the 'Z' serial suffix was given on page 110-5.




Duncan James has found this rather spectacular printing hiccup. The machine model / serial number cannot be determined, although the style of the '2' might, perhaps, suggest that it was a Frama machine.



Further to page 186-1, Peter Mantell reports a second example of the new PB312 sub-series. On this occasion, the serial number, PB 312033, is just 6 lower than the one previously reported.



Further to last month's report, Peter Mantell has found another Francotyp-Postalia frank with some additional bars – this time to the far left of the frank on a zero-value DX Mail item.



Peter Mantell has found a typo in the address block of this frank, which reads "Wilmslow Raod".

Peter Mantell reports the only slogan seen advertising the 23rd June 2016 EU Referendum. It comes from the Dacorum Borough Council. Dacorum is located in the north-west of Hertfordshire, in the East of England region, the Council itself being based in Hemel Hempstead. The logo of the Borough Council is depicted alongside.





Robert Petts sends these two printing hiccups.






Recent Interesting Items continued

Two examples of underpaid items have been reported where the matrix block has been manually erased by Royal Mail staff. The first example from Northampton and addressed to Germany, is reported by Peter Huss. It received a 'Revenue Protection' handstamp at the South Midlands Mail Centre because the rate for Europe was not paid by the user.




The second example is reported by your editor. The item was franked on a C4-sized envelope and received a 'Revenue Protection' handstamp at Southampton Mail Centre because the 'Large Letter' rate was not paid by the user.



Your editor does not know whether there is any operational significance in erasing matrix blocks in this way. However, it does appear to be Royal Mail policy to do so across the country.

Coloured Slogans

This month we have five black / coloured slogans not previously recorded – all kindly provided by Peter Mantell.



MailmarkTM News

Duncan James reports a 'Signed For' Large Letter 250g with £2.20 postage. This particular combination has not previously been reported. The matrix block decodes as Class 7 and Mail Type 2101.



Peter Mantell reports this Small Parcel frank with £4.17 postage, indicating a 'Signed For' item for Tariff 8 at a 1kg weight. As expected, the matrix block decodes as Class 7, and Mail Type 3100.

The cover was addressed to The Netherlands but was franked with only £0.20 postage, this being the internal 2nd class rate at the time. The cover duly received a Royal Mail Revenue Protection handstamp (shown alongside, below)



Meter Thematics



This could well be the first rocking horse that has been depicted in Meter News!


