The 'base figure' for the PB31 series is not known precisely (the lowest recorded is PB312039) but has been estimated as PB31200 for the purposes of this analysis.



The 'base figure' for the (7-digit) PB5575 series is not known precisely (the lowest recorded is PB5575255) but has been estimated as PB5575250 for the purposes of this analysis.

The total number of machines sold in 2016 was, therefore, 39695 and the percentage of 'Traditional' technology machines was 12.2%. At some stage in the future, all new machines sold will have 'SMART' technology. Mailmark has now been around for nearly three years which allows us to estimate the percentage split between old and new technology machines entering the market over that period.

#### 2016 Machine Sales Statistics continued

The graph below plots the decline in the proportion of old technology machines sold and attempts to predict future sales. The 2016 sales analysis above gives us our second 'real' data line on this graph and is shown as the solid red line. A year ago (on page 183-6) I predicted that the sales of old technology machines for 2016 would be 14% but the actual figure turns out to be 12%



The dotted red line is your editor's original prediction as to the likely tail-off of sales of 'old technology' machines over the next few years. If correct, this shows that, within four years, all new machines will have SMART technology fitted. However, old technology machines are likely to continue to be in use long after that - subject to any new Royal Mail regulations that may come into force at some stage, of course.



The following item has been franked '2 L Letter 250g' but also has an 'Advanced Mail' block (in error). The matrix block indicates 'Mail Type 0102', which aligns with the '2 L Letter 250g' rate.



### **Recent Interesting Items continued**

This item has been franked at the '2 Advanced' rate but has no corresponding Advanced Mail Block showing. Normally the Advanced Mail block is only supressed on '2 Advanced <u>Letter</u>' items.

#### **Mailmark News**

Peter Mantell reports this 10.0Kg Special Delivery 1PM (£500 compensation) that has not been reported before.

There are three interesting things to note about this frank. Firstly, I think that £26.60 is the highest amount paid that we have ever reported for a meter frank in Meter News. Secondly, the Mail Type (decoded from the matrix block) shows a Mail Type of '0104' which is the same code as that previously reported for the 2000g weight – I was expecting '0105'. Thirdly, £26.60 is the same amount that would be paid by general customers over the counter and hence there appears to be no discount given for meter users, whereas the 2000g rated is discounted from £11.00 down to £10.40 – strange!



Duncan James reports a frank that was posted on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> January using Royal Mail's 'Saturday Guarantee' service. Your editor has seen a few Horizon labels showing this service being used but this is the first time that I have seen one on a meter frank. The cost for using this service (for a 100g item with £500 compensation) by a meter user is £10.44 compared with £6.20 for the 'normal' service.




